WHERE ARE WE?

In about AD 150, The Greek astronomer Ptolemy believed that the Earth was at the centre of the solar system and that the planets and the Sun **30** _____ around it. If you have ever been lost in a city without the help of a street plan you will have some idea of the problems which **31** _____ scientists of old when they tried to imagine exactly where the Earth was in the Universe. You might be able to work out where you were in the city if you could have a bird's-eye view of the city as a whole. In the same way, if you could **32** _____ yourself from the Earth and look at it from space you would be able to see where it is.

It was not at all obvious to our ancestors that the Earth moves around the Sun, and it has taken many generations of hard work to devise an accurate "street plan" of space which pinpoints the Earth's position correctly.

Like us, our forefathers could look up at the night sky and **33** _____ a constantly changing pattern of bright objects including the much larger Moon. We know now that the Earth is just one of nine planets which together with their satellites, a belt of smaller rocky bodies called asteroids, some meteors and comets are all orbiting around the Sun some 140 million kilometers away.

This **34** _____ of various heavenly bodies is called the solar system. Our sun is quite an ordinary star, like hundreds that we can see in the sky at night. From the vantage point of the Earth, these stars appear to be united in patterns which have been given names like the Plough because of their **35** _____ in outline to more familiar objects.

Our solar system is just one of many similar systems which all **36** _____ into a larger unit called a galaxy, and there are millions of other galaxies in the Universe.
