PRESENT CONTINUOUS

1. We use **must** to say that something is **necessary** or **very important**.
2. We use **must not** (**mustn't**) to say that something is **not allowed**.

Subject	Auxiliary Verb	Main Verb	
I	must	go	home.
He	must not	spend	all his money.
You	mustn't	buy	unnecessary things.

3. We use **should** and **should not** (**shouldn't**) to show a kind of **obligation, duty** or **correctness**.

Subject	Auxiliary Verb	Main Verb	
You	should	spend	wisely.
They	shouldn't	shop	there.

Note: **Must** is a stronger word than **should**.
