PRESENT CONTINUOUS

- We use **must** to say that something is necessary or very important.
- We use **must not (mustn't)** to say that something is not allowed.

Subject	Auxiliary Verb	Main Verb	
I	must	go	home.
He	must not	spend	all his money.
You	mustn't	buy	unnecessary things.

- We use **should** and **should not (shouldn't)** to show a kind of obligation, duty or correctness.

Subject	Auxiliary Verb	Main Verb	
You	should	spend	wisely.
They	shouldn't	shop	there.

Note: **Must** is a stronger word than **should**.
