

Not only that, they also live on islands that are made of reeds, a plant found in nature. In Andalucia, in the south of Spain, some people live in underground houses called <i>cuevas</i>. During the winter, these houses stay warm. In the Philippines, some people still live in tree houses made of bamboo with grass roofs. China has many houses that are made of hard soil. Dirt becomes as strong as brick when it is packed hard. The Dayak people of Indonesia build some of their houses on stilts, several feet above the ground. The frame of the house is made of steel.
