3. \_\_\_\_\_: He is the one responsible for assigning duties and jobs (as directed by the captain) to other ranks in the deck department. He overlooks all deck operations, supervises the crew in daily work and takes care of cargo operations .
4. \_\_\_\_\_: He is responsible for upkeep and maintenance of all firefighting appliances (FFA) and life-saving appliances (LSA) on a ship. As a watchkeeping officer

and safety officer of the ship, He keeps watches, both at sea and at a port.(8-12 D/N during sailing and 6-12 D/N during port ).

5. \_\_\_\_\_:He helps the Master in all matters relating to shipboard labor management and vessel operations. He is in charge of the engine department and is responsible for E/R personnel and the proper operation, overhauling, and safety of the vessel's propulsion system, power generation system and all auxiliary machineries.
