

Had to/Didn't have to

HAD TO is the past of **HAVE TO** (and **MUST**)

Use **had to** or **didn't have to** + **VERB** **without TO** to talk about **PAST OBLIGATION**. Examples:

I **had to** study for my exam yesterday.

I **didn't have to** do any homework last summer because I passed all my exams.

Did you **have to** work last summer?
Yes, I did. / No, I didn't.
