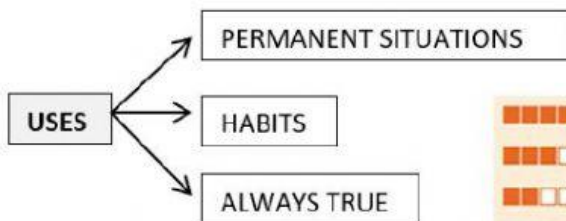


# PRESENT SIMPLE

## PRESENT SIMPLE

	Affirmative	Negative
I	play	don't play
you	play	don't play
he / she / it	plays	doesn't play
we / you / they	play	don't play

Interrogative	Short answers	
	Affirmative	Negative
Do I play?	Yes, you do.	No, you don't.
Do you play?	Yes, I do.	No, I don't.
Does he / she / it play?	Yes, he / she / it does.	No, he / she / it doesn't.
Do we / you / they play?	Yes, we / you / they do.	No, we / you / they don't.

usually	I <b>always</b> go to school by bike.
often	Adverb + to be
sometimes	I <b>am never</b> late for school.
never
