Future Simple

- We use the Future Simple for:

- 1- decisions made at the time of speaking.
*e.g.: I'm starving. I'll **make** a sandwich.
- 2- predictions. *e.g.: People **will live** longer in the future.
- 3- promises. *e.g.: I'll **help** you design your website.
- 4- threats. *e.g.: Stop wasting your time online or I'll **take** away your computer.
- 5- talking about future facts.
*e.g.: The new social networking site **will be** for elderly people.
- 6- offering to do something for someone. *e.g.: I'll **get** the door for you.
- 7- asking someone to do something.
*e.g.: **Will** you **help** me carry these boxes, please?

Be going to

- We use the *be going to* for:

- 1- future plans. *e.g.: Tim's **going to invest** in MyFace shares.
- 2- predictions for the near future based on present situations or evidence.
*e.g.: Look at the queue! It's **going to take** hours to get the concert tickets.

*** KEY WORDS (SOME OF THE COMMON TIME EXPRESSIONS THAT ARE OFTEN USED WITH FUTURE SIMPLE & BE GOING TO.):**

(this week/month/..., tonight, this evening, tomorrow, tomorrow morning/night, next week/year, at the weekend, in December, in a few minutes/hours/days, on *Saturday*, on *Friday morning*, etc.)

Future Continuous:

- We use the Future Continuous for:

1- actions that will be in progress at a specific time in the future.

*e.g.: I'll **be watching** a film at 9 o'clock tonight.

2- plans and arrangements for the future.

*e.g.: The writers **will be meeting** the editor next week.

*** KEY WORDS :** (this time next week/month/summer, this time tomorrow morning/afternoon/night, etc...)

Future Perfect Simple:

- We use the Future Perfect Simple to talk about:

1- something that will be finished by or before a specific time in the future.

*e.g.: Marty **will have designed** the new website by Friday.

2- the length of time that an action will have lasted for at a point of time in the future.

*e.g.: I **will have been** a member of MyFace for five years next month.

*** KEY WORDS :** (by the end of the week/month/ year, by this time tomorrow, by tomorrow morning/10 o'clock/2015, etc...)

Future Perfect Continuous:

- We use the Future Perfect Continuous for:

1- showing that something will continue until a particular event or time in the future.

*e.g.: I **will have been studying** for three years when I graduate from university.

2- actions that will be in progress in the future and will have an effect on a later action.

*e.g.: The band will be great when they perform because they **will have been rehearsing** for months.

Shall

- We use *shall* to make a suggestion or an offer.

*e.g.: **Shall we** eat out tonight?

*e.g.: **Shall I** book the tickets online?

Tense	Active Form
Future Present	Subj + will + Base Verb + (the complement)
Be going to	Subj + is/am/are + going to + Base Verb +
Future Continuous	Subj + will + be + V-ing +
Future Perfect Simple	Subj+ will + have + V3 +
Future Perfect Continuous	Subj+ will + have + been + V-ing +

• Negative Sentences Structures:

Tense	Active Form
Future Present	Subj + won't + Base Verb +
Be going to	Subj + is/am/are + not + going to + Base V. +
Future Continuous	Subj + won't + be + V-ing +
Future Perfect Simple	Subj+ won't + have + V3 +
Future Perfect Continuous	Subj+ won't + have + been + V-ing +
