# Future Simple

- We use the Future Simple for:
  - 1- decisions made at the time of speaking.
    - \*e.g.: I'm starving. I'll make a sandwich.
  - 2- predictions. \*e.g.: People will live longer in the future.
  - 3- promises. \*e.g.: I'll help you design your website.
  - 4- threats. \*e.g.: Stop wasting your time online or I'll take away your computer.
  - 5- talking about future facts.
    - \*e.g.: The new social networking site will be for elderly people.
  - 6- offering to do something for someone. \*e.g.: I'll get the door for you.
  - 7- asking someone to do something.
    - \*e.g.: Will you help me carry these boxes, please?

# Be going to

- We <u>use</u> the be going to for:
  - 1- future plans. \*e.g.: Tim's going to invest in MyFace shares.
  - 2- predictions for the near future based on present situations or evidence.

    \*e.g.: Look at the queue! It's going to take hours to get the concert tickets.

# \* KEY WORDS (SOME OF THE COMMON TIME EXPRESSIONS THAT ARE OFTEN USED WITH FUTURE SIMPLE & BE GOING TO.):

(this week/month/..., tonight, this evening, tomorrow, tomorrow morning/night, next week/year, at the weekend, in December, in a few minutes/hours/days, on *Saturday, on Friday morning*, etc.)

#### **Future Continuous:**

- We <u>use</u> the Future Continuous for:
- 1- actions that will be in progress at a specific time in the future.
  - \*e.g.: I'll be watching a film at 9 o'clock tonight.
- 2- plans and arrangements for the future.
  - \*e.g.: The writers will be meeting the editor next week.
- \* **KEY WORDS**: (this time next week/month/summer, this time tomorrow morning/afternoon/night, etc...)

# **Future Perfect Simple:**

- We <u>use</u> the Future Perfect Simple to talk about:
- 1- something that will be finished by or before a specific time in the future.
  - \*e.g.: Marty will have designed the new website by Friday.
- 2- the length of time that an action will have lasted for at a point of time in the future.
  - \*e.g.: I will have been a member of MyFace for five years next month.
- \* **KEY WORDS**: (by the end of the week/month/ year, by this time tomorrow, by tomorrow morning/10 o'clock/2015, etc...)

# Future Perfect Continuous:

- We use the Future Perfect Continuous for:
- 1- showing that something will continue until a particular event or time in the future.
  - \*e.g.: I will have been studying for three years when I graduate from university.
- 2- actions that will be in progress in the future and will have an effect on a later action.
  - \*e.g.: The band will be great when they perform because they **will have been** rehearsing for months.

# <u>Shall</u>

- We <u>use</u> shall to make a suggestion or an offer.
  - \*e.g.: Shall we eat out tonight?
  - \*e.g.: Shall I book the tickets online?
