

COMPARATIVE AND SUPERLATIVE

I. COMPARATIVE

S Be short adj _ ER	<i>one syllable: new – newer, hot – hotter</i>	THAN
	<i>two syllables ending in:</i> <i>–y: friendly – friendlier</i> <i>–et: quiet – quieter</i> <i>–le: simple – simpler</i> <i>–ow: narrow – narrower</i> <i>–ce: fierce – fiercer</i> <i>–er: clever – cleverer</i>	

MORE long adj: more handsome, more beautiful, more intelligent ...

Example: This bike is newer than that bike.

She is friendlier than Tom.

He is more intelligent than his brother.

II. SUPERLATIVE

S Be THE short adj _ EST	<i>one syllable: new – newest, hot – hottest</i>	N
	<i>two syllables ending in:</i> <i>–y: friendly – friendliest</i> <i>–et: quiet – quietest</i> <i>–le: simple – simplest</i> <i>–ow: narrow – narrowest</i> <i>–ce: fierce – fiercest</i> <i>–er: clever – cleverest</i>	

MOST long adj: the most handsome, most beautiful, most intelligent ...
