










CLASSIFICATION OR CLASSIFY

When you classify things, you put them into groups that are related or have something in common.

Below is a picture of all school supply items, so they all belong in one group.



Examples:

	<i>Things that belong together</i>		
The items that are circled are balls. The item in the middle is a food item. The balls belong in the same group.			
The items that are circled are dinosaurs. The item not circled is a bow which is not an animal. The dinosaurs belong to the same group.			
The items that are circled are butterflies. The item not circled is a bird. The butterflies belong in the same group.			
The animals circled live in the water. The item in the middle is an animal that lives on land. The ocean animals belong in the same group.
