ERIN MCKEAN Lexicographer

Erin McKean is a lexicographer; she writes dictionaries. She searches for words everywhere—from books and blogs, to parties and Twitter feeds. She recently started *Wordnik*, an online dictionary that contains all the traditionally accepted words and definitions, but also asks users to contribute new words and new uses for old words. McKean is also an active blogger and the author of many books, including the *Weird and Wonderful Words* series.

Erin McKean's idea worth spreading is that making up new words will help us use language to express what we mean and will create new ways for us to understand one another.
