SUBJECT: Reading Comprehension

TOPIC: Main Idea and Supporting Details

TIP: Think about the supporting details to figure out the main idea. Ask, "What idea do all these details tell about?"

Every paragraph, story, or article that you read have a **topic**—what the piece of writing is about. The **main idea** is the most important idea that the writer wants you to remember about the topic. Recognizing the main idea can help you understand and remember what you read. Writers sometimes state the main idea in a **topic sentence**. A topic sentence can appear at the beginning, middle, or end of a piece of writing.

Supporting details are smaller pieces of information that tell more about the main idea. As you read, use supporting details to help you identify the main idea.
