

The participle

There are two kinds of participles:

the present participle

- infinitive + -ing
- e.g.: waiting, writing, swimming
- usage: You use the present participle in all the progressive forms of the verb

the past participle

- infinitive + -ed; irregular forms!
- e.g.: waited, written, swum
- usage: You use the past participle in the present perfect, past perfect and all the passive forms.
