TIP:

Summarizing is putting important information gathered from other sources in your own words. Only the main points are needed when summarizing. It is shorter than the actual passage and your opinion is not included in the summary.

Paraphrasing is restating the ideas of someone else in your own words. The information is not rewritten word for word. Paraphrasing is similar to summarizing, only the main (most important) points are restated.

PASSAGE 2

THE BEAT GOES ON



What happens if you give a baby a spoon and a pot to pound on? You have a drum. Drums are among the earliest tools used by people. Drums have probably been around for at least 8,000 years.

Drums come in all sizes and shapes. Some are beautiful instruments that take years to make. Others are hollow logs or garbage can lid. Ringo was the drummer of the music group the Beatles. He first beat on biscuit tins with sticks of wood!

Different types of drums make different sounds. A steel drum sounds unlike a drum made of wood, leather, or clay. A drum shaped like a barrel sounds different from a drum shaped like a box.

How a drum is played also has to do with how it sounds. “Talking” drums are played to sound like voices. Some drums are struck with padded sticks or thin wooden sticks. Others are struck with the drummer’s hands.

With drums and drumming, the beat goes on.
