His parents were Norwegian and his father died when Roald was only three years old. His mother, Sophie, had to raise her six children alone. Roald always remembered her as a very strong woman.

Later, he went to school. He was very unhappy at school.

He worked as a pilot but what he really liked was writing. He wrote short stories for adults. Then he started writing books for children. His first book for children was "The Gremlins". He wrote twenty-one children's books. Some of his books are really famous and are films today. They are "Charlie and the chocolate factory", "Matilda" or "The BFG" ("The Big Friendly Giant").

The illustrations of his books were beautiful. His illustrator's name was Quentin Blake.

What is fantastic about Roald Dahl is that both adults and children loved his books.

He died in November, 1990.
