




Read the article about an artist named Alexander Calder. Think about what the article is mostly about.

Later Alexander went to see a friend's paintings. He thought it would be a good idea if art didn't just stand still. He wanted everything in the paintings to move. Alexander began making mobiles. He created shapes that hung from the ceiling. Air made the mobiles move. Soon Alexander Calder became famous for his mobiles. Today you can see these mobiles in museums all over the world.
