

Pronouns

RULES

A **pronoun** is a word that takes the place of one or more nouns.

A pronoun must match the noun it refers to.

Pam is lost. **She** is lost.

The storm was frightening. **It** was frightening.

Pronouns can be singular or plural. Singular pronouns take the place of singular nouns. Plural pronouns replace plural nouns or a group of nouns.

Singular Pronouns

I, you, he, she, it, me, him, her

Plural Pronouns

we, you, they, us, them
