Alison the meeting up the previous day.
11. The ending of the play was so unexpected that the audience fell silent. **such**
The play ended in that the audience fell silent.
12. There was no cheese left in the shop. **run**
The shop cheese.
13. Mr Brown will distribute the concert tickets at the end of the meeting. **given**
The concert tickets by Mr Brown at the end of the meeting.
