Mary, who was a young woman gentle and good, lived in the town of Nazareth. She was soon to marry a carpenter named Joseph. She was visited by an angel named Gabriel who told her that she would have a son and that she should name him Jesus. He is the one God has sent to save us. The great **Augustus**, emperor of Rome, ordered that all subjects be counted in a census. Every Jewish man had to report to his hometown to ensure that his name was added to the electoral roll.
