When comparing similar objects or things, **conjunctions** can be used to link clauses and ideas together. **Conjunctions** can also be used when contrasting the differences between objects and things.

**Pronouns** are used to link ideas without making the links repetitive.

James has red hair. James has a fair complexion. James is tall. James is athletic. James is a good basketball player. James has a friend Alex. Alex is athletic. Alex plays soccer.

Along with having red hair and a fair complexion, James is tall. Like his friend Alex, James is athletic and likes to play sport. However, James prefers to play basketball while his friend prefers playing soccer.

Paper Planes, the novel, has three main characters. The movie has the same main characters. In the novel the main characters are Dylan, Jason (his father) and Patrick, his rival. These are the same characters in the movie. In the movie and the novel the characters have the same physical traits and mostly the same personalities. There are some differences.
