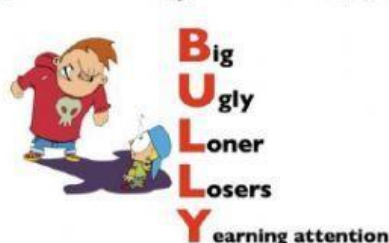
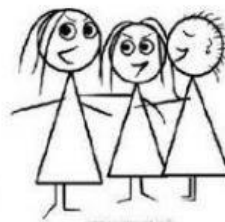


I/ Pre-reading activity
