The singing Terraces

Can a terrace sing? This is quite unlikely, however if you travel to the small village of Horodnie close to Kharkiv, you might be surprised. The place is beautiful, peaceful and cozy.

The structure was built by Pavel Kharytonenko. According to legend, he had a daughter - Natalia. Natalia was a really good singer, so her father built terraces for her. However, it is more likely that Pavel Kharytonenko was a keen gardener and wanted to grow some rare plants. Since the local climate was too severe for exotic trees in an ordinary garden, the terraces were built. There are six brick terraces facing south, arranged in a semicircle. This often reminds visitors of the ancient amphitheaters. The height of each wall is about four metres and the width is approximately ten. Consequently, the plants have constant sunshine and the bricks accumulate and keep warmth for a long time. Immediately after the construction of the terraces, strawberries, grapes and exotic fruit trees were planted there. However, soon it was noticed that because of its unusual layout the orchard could also amplify the volume of sounds.

The place was abandoned until the end of World War II. It was then reconstructed and apple trees were planted there. Now this unique structure is a popular tourist destination. It hosts an annual festival of Ukrainian folk songs - 'Green terraces'.
