

Platitude	(in some British and Australian schools) an older student who is given some authority and helps to control the younger students
Frog-marched	to force someone who is unwilling to move forward by holding the person's arms behind their back and then pushing them forward:
Agenda	someone who is easily annoyed and complains a lot
Confrontation(s)	a remark or statement that may be true but is boring and has no meaning because it has been said so many times before
Harbour(ed)	the beginning of an organization or official activity
Vested (interest)	a person who is not loyal or stops being loyal to their own country, social class, beliefs, etc.
Ill-inspired	answering questions in a way that is not direct or clear, especially because you do not want to give an honest answer
Inception	a fight or argument
Relaunch	new attempt to sell a product or service, often by advertising it in a different way or making it available in a different form
Evasive	a list of matters to be discussed at a meeting
Prefect	likely to fail or have bad consequences
Grump(ing)	to think about or feel something, usually over a long period:
Traitor	a strong personal interest in something because you could get an advantage from it
