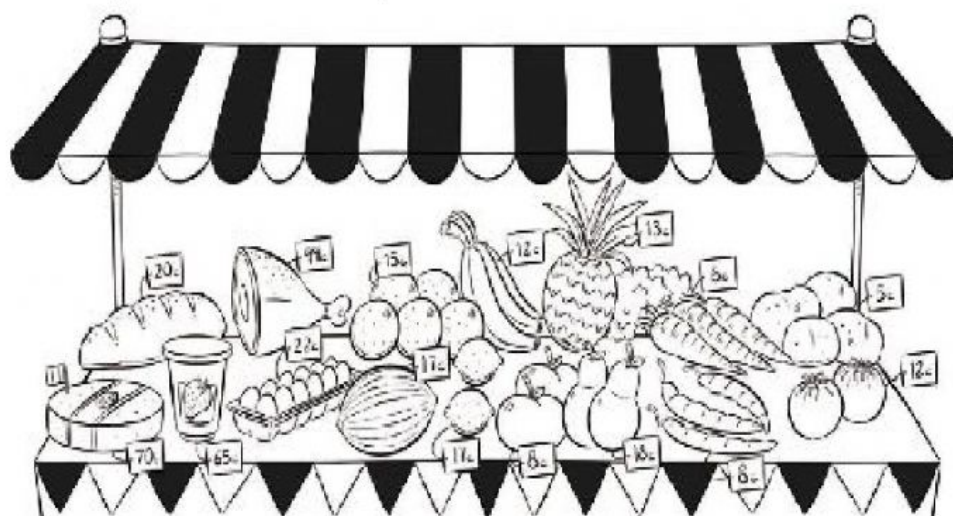

#### A/an/ some

##### A/an

We use A/AN with COUNTABLES in SINGULAR.

A + noun starting with a consonant.

For example: A biscuit

An + noun starting with a vowel.

For example: An apple

##### Some

We use SOME with UNCOUNTABLES in

SINGULAR (rice, milk, water, sugar, bread...)

For example: Some water

We use SOME with COUNTABLES in PLURAL.

For example: Some bananas
