Family Island Administrators

In the Bahamas, all of the islands except New Providence are referred to as "the Family Island". During the early period of settlement, the management of affairs, or **administration**, on each island was carried out by resident justices. They were responsible to the government's Chief Justice. In 1908 this system changed; the justices on the islands were replaced by *District Commissioners*. Later they were called *Family Island Commissioners*. An Act of Parliament in 1996 brought about the change from Commissioner to *Family Island Administrators*.
