Simple Present	- Future Simple Tense (will) - Infinitive - Modal + infinitive
If I study hard,	I will pass the exams.
If she comes ,	I will give her a ring.
If she doesn't come ,	I will go back home.
If you see John tonight,	tell him to e-mail me.
If Ben gets up early,	he can catch the bus.

This conditional deals with "unreal, but likely" situations in the present or future. We call it "unreal" because situation we are describing hasn't happened yet, and "likely" because we can easily imagine it happening. We use the first conditional to describe these situations.

*****The if-clause can be at the beginning or at the end of the sentence.**

If I **study** hard, I **will pass** the exams.

I **will pass** the exams if I **study** hard.
