



### The First Conditional

First conditional is used to talk about actions/events in the future which are likely to happen or have a real possibility of happening.

Structure :

If + Present + Subject + will + infinitive (without to)

Simple

- ↓ ↓ ↓ ↓ ↓
- If it rains, I will stay at home.

(I think there is a real possibility of rain. In this condition, I will stay at home).

- If my father doesn't buy me a bike for my birthday, I will cry a lot.
- If my father won't buy me a bike for my birthday, I will cry a lot.

(I think there is a real possibility that my father won't buy me a bike. In this condition, I will cry a lot).

NOTE: You can start the first conditional with the subject but don't use the comma (,) to separate any sentence:

- I will cry a lot if my father doesn't buy me a bike for my birthday.

- Write sentences using the first conditional.

Example: the weather / be good we / go / to the beach tomorrow.

If the weather is good, we will go to the beach tomorrow.
