

AGREEING:

- + We use SO + AUXILIARY VERB + SUBJECT (personal pronoun or noun) to agree with a positive statement. A: Tom lives in London. B: So do I.
- TOO: SUBJECT+AUXILIARY+TOO

A) I got late. B) I was too.

- – We use NEITHER + AUXILIARY VERB + SUBJECT (personal pronoun or noun) to agree with a negative statement. A. Jim doesn't like horror films. B: Neither/nor does Fred.
- EITHER: SUBJECT+NEGATIVE AUXILIARY+ EITHER

A) I haven't seen that movie B) I haven't either.
