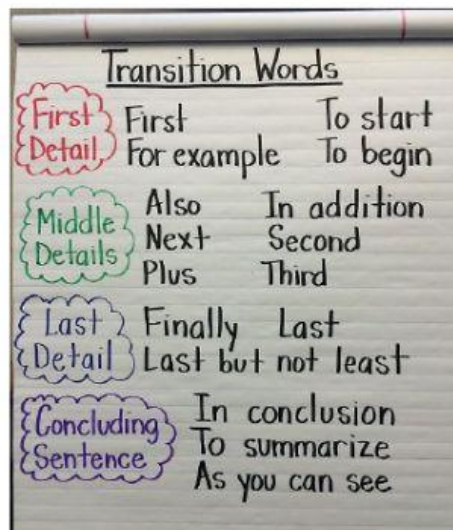

<p>Step 1 — write an outline</p> <p>When writing a paragraph, first write an outline of the paragraph and include or brainstorming:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the topic supporting information. 	<p>Example</p> <p>Topic — smoking & health hazards</p> <p>Outline</p> <p>Lung cancer — proven link</p> <p>Other lung diseases — emphysema, bronchitis</p> <p>Heart disease — risk factor</p> <p>Passive smoking — effect on others</p>
<p>Step 2 — write the topic sentence</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write a topic sentence. 	<p>Example</p> <p>There are several serious health hazards directly linked to smoking.</p>
<p>Step 3 — write supporting sentences</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Next write a supporting sentence for each point. Use facts or examples to support your points. 	<p>Example</p> <p>The link between smoking and cancer is well known. As well smoking is linked to other lung diseases like emphysema and bronchitis. Smokers also have a greater risk of heart disease later in life. This is evidenced in recent court cases in the USA where smokers have been awarded damages from tobacco companies. Further, there is substantial research that even passive smoking can have long term effects on health.</p>

Tip

When writing it is essential to pay close attention to punctuation.

Capital letters are used at the beginning of sentences, for someone's name, and the pronoun *I*. They are also used for names of places, days of the week, and months.

Commas are used between two halves of a sentence before the words: *but, so, and, for, nor, yet*. You can also use commas between items in lists as well as at the beginning and end of letters.

How to Boil an Egg
