Citizenship Responsibility	Action
Understand and obey Canada's laws.	I volunteer at the food bank every week.
Vote in elections.	I attend multicultural events in the community to learn about other traditions.
Strive to eliminate discrimination and injustice.	When driving, I make sure I understand and follow the rules of the road.
Care for and protect Canada's heritage and environment.	I read about political issues and make sure I am registered to vote in municipal, provincial, and federal elections.
Help others in the community.	I encourage my kids to learn about Canadian history, and to protect Canada's wildlife.
Support Canada's ideals and values.	I complain to the local government if I see that people with disabilities don't have equal access to all services.
