In the late 18th century, a man called Abraham Darby built the world's first iron bridge, across the River Severn in England. He also built houses for his factory workers and he paid them more money than other factories did. Today, the whole area of Ironbridge is a group of ten living museums, where visitors can learn about history and see how things like iron and glass were made 100 years ago. To make Ironbridge seem real, most of its staff dress in 19th-century clothes. Visitors can dress like this for a special photo at the old photographer's shop, at any time of the day they choose. Tourists like to visit the bridge and the old factories, as well as the different houses where people lived. The tables and chairs inside Rosehill House and Dale House were actually used by members of the Darby family, and people usually spend at least an hour looking at everything there. It takes even longer to walk around Blists Hill, which is a complete Victorian town, with an old bank, a sweet shop, a chemist's and several other shops.
