REGULAR AND IRREGULAR VERBS

REGULAR VERBS	IRREGULAR VERBS
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Regular verbs form their past and past participle forms by adding -ed. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Irregular verbs form their past and past participle forms in different ways.
<p>There are mainly rules of regular verbs</p> <p>Rule #1</p> <p>If a verb ends in -e, add -d.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> like → liked arrive → arrived decide → decided <p>Rule #2</p> <p>If a verb ends in consonant + -y, change -y to -i and add -ed.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> carry → carried try → tried study → studied <p>Rule #3</p> <p>If a verb ends in vowel + -y, add -ed.*</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> play → played stay → stayed enjoy → enjoyed 	<p>There are mainly three types of irregular verbs:</p> <p>Type # 1</p> <p>Verbs in which all the three forms are the same (e.g. put – put – put)</p> <p>Type # 2</p> <p>Verbs in which two of the three forms are the same (e.g. sit – sat – sat)</p> <p>Type # 3</p> <p>Verbs in which all three forms are different (e.g. drink – drank – drunk)</p>

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Rule #4

If a verb ends in a consonant-vowel-consonant (CVC) pattern, double the final consonant and add *-ed*.**

- hug → hugged
- plan → planned
- stop → stopped

Rule #5

For all other verbs, add *-ed*.

- watch → watched
- ask → asked
- clean → cleaned

Some verbs can be both regular and irregular.

Burn – burnt – burnt (irregular)

Burn – burned – burned (regular)

Dream – dreamt – dreamt (irregular)

Dream – dreamed – dreamed (regular)

Lean – lent – lent (irregular)

Lean – leaned – leaned (regular)

Learn – learnt – learnt (irregular)

Learn – learned – learned (regular)

Leap – leapt – leapt (irregular)

Leap – leaped – leaped (regular)

Smell – smelt – smelt (irregular)

Smell – smelled – smelled (regular)

Spill – spilt – spilt (irregular)

Spill – spilled – spilled (regular)

Spoil – spoilt – spoilt (irregular)

Spoil – spoiled – spoiled (regular)
