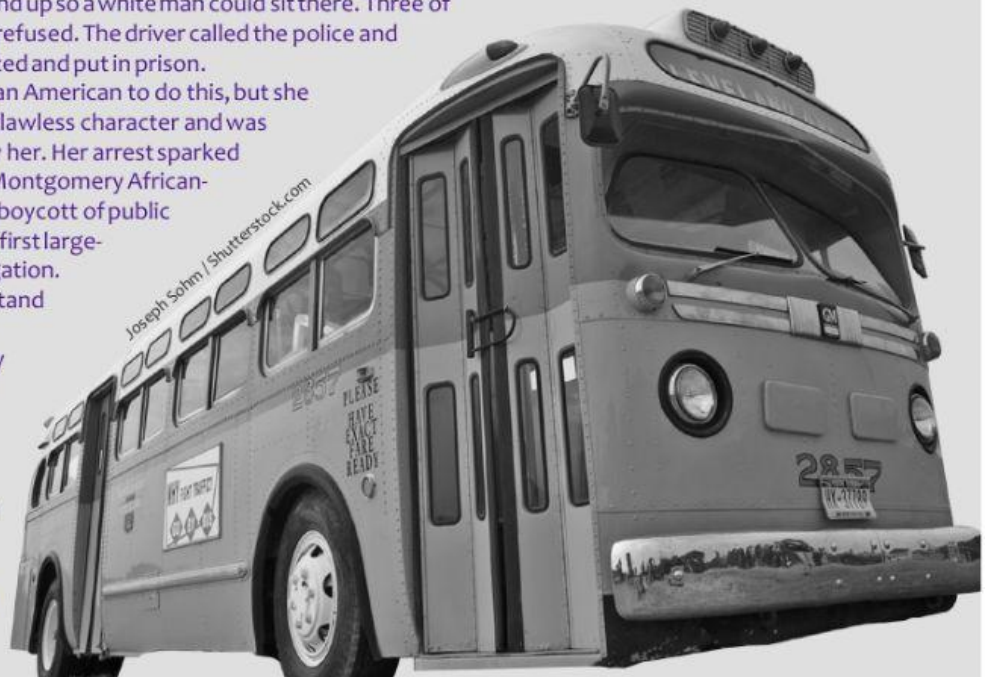

What if ... ?

On a typical December evening in 1955, a 42-year-old woman boarded a bus in the state of Alabama. She was returning home after a long and hard day's work. She took a seat near the middle of the bus, just behind the front "white" section. On the city buses of Montgomery, Alabama, the front seats were always reserved for white passengers. At the next stop, more passengers got on the bus, and as every seat in the white section was taken, the bus driver ordered the passengers in the middle row to stand up so a white man could sit there. Three of the passengers moved; Rosa Parks refused. The driver called the police and Mrs. Parks was arrested, fingerprinted and put in prison.

Rosa Parks was not the first African American to do this, but she was considered to be a woman of a flawless character and was held in high esteem by all who knew her. Her arrest sparked a collective community response: Montgomery African-American citizens started a 381-day boycott of public buses, which became the country's first large-scale demonstration against segregation.

Going back in time we can understand why Rosa Parks' courage was so extraordinary. She made a very risky choice. When the bus driver asked her to move to another seat, Mrs. Parks remain seated, fearless and calm. Years later, she wrote in her autobiography that if she had given more thought to the probable consequences of her refusal, she might have gotten off the bus. Her decision changed the history of American civil rights.
