

HOW TO PRONOUNCE -ed AT THE END OF A VERB

There are **three different ways** to pronounce the 'ed' ending of regular verbs in the simple past tense: /Id/, /t/ or /d/. The pronunciation depends on **the sound at the end of the infinitive** of the verb.

/Id/	/t/	/d/	
This is the least common -ed sound	-Words that end in /p/, /k/, /f/, /s/, /sh/, /ch/ sound:	This is the most common -ed sound	
-Words that end in /t/ or /d/sound: Wanted /'wpn.trd/ Needed /'ni:.did/ Started /sta:rtid/ Decided /di'sai.did/	Kissed /kɪst/ Laughed /lɑːft/ Asked /ɑːskt/ Stopped /stopt/ Watched /wɒtʃt/ Washed /wɒʃt/	-Words that end in any other sound: Closed /kləʊzd/ Saved /seɪvd/ Travelled /'træv.əld/ Opened /'əʊ.pənd/ Climbed /klaɪmd/
