

Not enough..... too....

Use **too** + adjective / adverb to explain why you don't like something or to talk about problems. Use **not** + adjective / adverb + **enough** when you need more.

Most people are *too conservative* to change their eating habits.
We *aren't* usually *adventurous enough* to experiment.
