DWI	It occurs when an individual's character or reputation is tarnished as a result of a fraudulent statement or action of another individual. (there are two types: spoken,
Bribery	called slander, and written, called libel.) It is when something is made falsely especially with intent to deceive. e.g. He signatures.
Defamation	The crime of using dishonest methods to take something valuable from another person. e.g. He was found guilty of bank
Forgery	It is to take something away from by force: steal from. It is to take personal property from by violence or threat. e.g. He jewelry.
Fraud	It is the unlawful deposit of any type of waste material that is less than 200 liters in volume (about the volume of a wheelie bin) and penalties apply.
Robbery	The crime of driving a vehicle while intoxicated. e.g. Dan was arrested for
Rape	unlawful sexual activity and usually sexual intercourse carried out forcibly or under threat of injury against a person's will or with a person who is beneath a certain age or incapable of valid consent because of mental illness, mental deficiency,
	intoxication, unconsciousness, or deception.
Shoplifting	It is the systematic use of terror especially as a means of coercion, e.g. They have been arrested for acts of
Vandalism	It comes from the noun which is money of avor given or promised in order to influence the judgment or conduct of a person in a position of trust, e.g. Police officers accused of taking
Drug dealing	It is to steal displayed goods from a store. e.g. The manager saw the kids and called the police.
Mugging	It is the sex between a married person and someone who is not that person's wife or husband. e.g. He found out that his wife had committed
Adultery	It is the act or practice of engaging in promiscuous sexual relations especially for money.
Prostitution	It is to assault usually with intent to rob. It is also to attack suddenly
Organized crime	Willful or malicious destruction or defacement of public or private property.
Terrorism	It is a person who sells illegal drugs.
Littering	It is a group of professional criminals who work together as part of a powerful and secret organization. e.g. He has links to
