RULES

A **subject pronoun** is used as the subject of a sentence. It tells whom or what the sentence is about.

I like the Stars baseball players.

They work hard in every game.

A subject pronoun, like a subject noun, may be singular or plural.

Singular	I, you, he, she, it
Plural	we, you, they
