Home Cooking

Do you prefer to order food to or cook at home? When you're tired and hungry at the end of the day, you may want to order a pizza or other "fast food." However, a home-cooked meal is a better choice for many reasons. Home-cooked meals are usually cheaper, they're almost always healthier, and sometimes even faster.

Burgers, pizza, and other "fast food" may appear less expensive than buying groceries. However, if you're careful when you shop, you can spend less money. When you shop, you can choose the freshest and healthiest **ingredients**. On the other hand, when you order food, you don't know how fresh the ingredients are, or how the food was prepared. For example, you can choose to cook with less butter at home, but if you order food, you can't control the amount of butter. You might think it's faster to order food than to cook. But after you order, you have to wait until the food arrives. And sometimes that takes a long time!

Ordering a pizza or other "fast food" may seem faster and less expensive than cooking, but if you plan ahead, buying groceries can be cheaper. When you shop and cook your own meals, you can also choose fresher, healthier ingredients. And you don't have to wait for someone else to cook and deliver your food! Cooking at home is the better choice.
