

C. We will now see how a paragraph is written. This is the **WRITING KINGDOM** plan that I made for you, just to show you how **MAGIC** writing can be! Look at the TIP and the plan and try to find out if the paragraph above is a good or bad one!!

TIP

What makes a good paragraph?

1. The **title** is the **KING**. He is such a show-off!
2. The **topic sentence** is the **QUEEN** of the paragraph! She is always present!
3. **Only one main idea** is present! **UNITY** in the kingdom!
4. **All other sentences** are the **SUBJECTS**. They serve the Queen!
And they must work smoothly and logically!
5. The **conclusion** is the precious **PRINCE**! He may be present if he wishes so!
6. **LOVE** is in the air! Express **feelings** at all times! Use beautiful adjectives and nouns.
7. Captain **HOOK**, an **attention grabber**, may make our readers more interested!

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Outlining a basic paragraph

An **attention grabber** (or **HOOK**) is optional. It may be a picture, a quotation, a rhetorical question, a shocking statement. Anything that will make the reader interested!

The **title/KING** leads and informs of what is to follow. It is usually a show-off!

The **topic sentence** is (preferably) first in order! It is not too general or too specific! It is the **QUEEN** after all!

The **points and supporting sentences** develop the topic sentence. They serve as **SUBJECTS** to the queen!

TIP
There are sometimes more sentences in a paragraph which usually answer to questions such as **Who, What, When, Where, Why**. Their role is **informative and decorative**.

The **concluding sentence/PRINCE** is optional. It ends the paragraph, leaves the reader with important points to remember, but is often unnecessary.
