SUBJECT PRONOUNS

Subject pronouns (I, you, we, etc.) are necessary to describe what different people do and avoid repetition. Instead of saying *Mike did this, Mike went here, Mike found this,* we eventually switch from *Mike* to *he.*

l = Je	We = Nous
You (informal) = Tu	You all; You (formal) = Vous
he = il	They (masculine) = ils
she = elle	they (feminine) = elles

You have already seen these pronouns in phrases like: "Comment t'appelles-tu?" and "Je m'appelle_____."
