In Scotland there is a 1_____ tale of a beast called the Loch Ness Monster that lives in the waters of Loch Ness. To the locals it is simply known as 'Nessie'.

The word 'loch' is Scottish for 'lake'. The loch is very deep and long, which makes it an ideal place for such a shy and 2_____ creature to hide. There have been many recorded 3_____ of the monster going back as far as the 6th century. The first photographic 4_____ was captured in 1934 by Dr Kenneth Wilson, a physician from London.
