Passage 2

Mixed-Up Information

Miss Freed decided to play a trick on her students. She wrote a bunch of information on the board about dinosaurs and then started asking the students questions about the information. None of them could answer because the information was all mixed up.

The Pleistocene Epoch is the geologic time beginning about 1- ¼ million years ago and ending about 10,000 years ago. It included a period called the Ice Age. It was during the Ice Age that the last of the prehistoric animals, like the giant ground sloth, the Woolly Rhinoceros, and the Mastodon, died out. The giant ground sloth was as big as an elephant and used long, hook-like claws to pull down tree branches. The Woolly Rhinoceros, or “hollow-tooth,” ate small bushes and poor grass and looked much like the rhinoceros that live in Africa today. The Mastodon was also an elephant like creature with a thick coat of reddish-brown hair and 8-9 foot long tusks.
