Lexi: the language learning app which helps you learn cool words!

Before long, Lexi had been downloaded by thousands of youngsters and it was being talked about all over Facebook and Twitter.

Despite its success, Lexi has been controversial. Recently a group of language teachers criticised the app, saying that it doesn't take languages seriously and that you can't be a successful language learner if you just learn the fashionable words. However, Marcy disagrees with the critics and says that if it wasn't for Lexi, many children would not be learning languages at all. She strongly believes that if you want someone to learn something, it has to be fun. And no one can say that Lexi isn't fun because users haven't stopped using it this month.

So what does the future hold for Marcy? She's one of a growing army of young developers who've made a lot of money before they've even finished school and some might say she's achieved more than most people would in a lifetime. However, Marcy says that for her it's just the beginning and she hopes to develop more apps that will inspire people to learn. She's also aware that software development is dominated by men and, as a woman, she's looking forward to being part of a new movement of women developers. We certainly wish Macy good luck!
