- b) after some verbs: like, hate, enjoy, love, avoid.
- c) Gerunds can function as the subject of a sentence.
- d) after a preposition: interested in

- **Writing** in English is difficult.
- **Watching** TV is my favorite pastime.

As direct object of a sentence

- I like **writing** in English.
- I love **going** out to restaurants.

As a subject complement

- My cat's favorite activity is **sleeping**.
- One of his duties is **doing** homework.

COMMON SPORTS AROUND THE WORLD

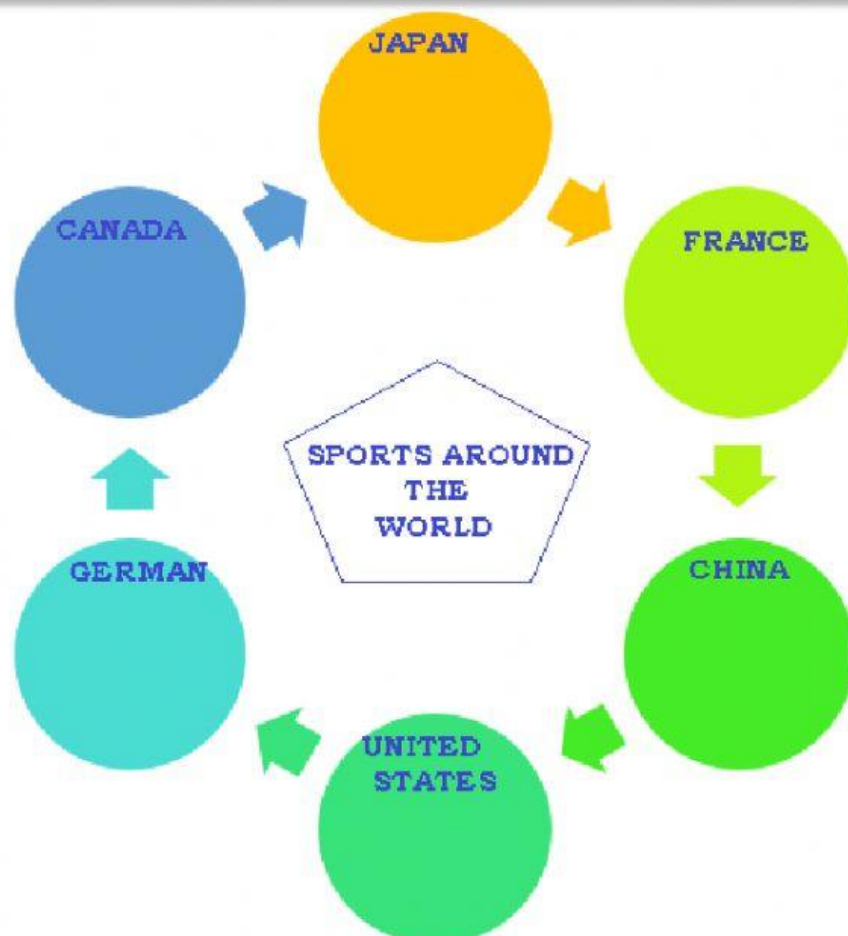
- A. Read the text and complete the mind map using the sports mentioned in the previous text.

In France, many people watch and practice sports like soccer, rugby, motorsports, and cycling. For Germans, watching and playing soccer is very common. In India it is not difficult to find people who love cricket. Playing kabaddi, a national contact team sport, is typical in this country. In Japan, people enjoy watching or practicing sumo, judo, karate, and kendo. The Japanese are also interested in western sports such as baseball and football. Some say sports in the United States are going through a revolution now. People believe that in this country American football, basketball, and baseball are the only popular sports, but more and more Americans are interested in other sports like hockey and soccer.

The truth is that it is typical for a country to generally prefer a sport or two, but most like watching all sorts of sports.
