
Lesson 3: *Might for future possibility*

A. THEORY

MIGHT

Use **Might**
use might to refer to weak possibility.

- I might go to Japan for a month to study Japanese.
- The dog might bark when we pass by the gate.
- They might not like very hot food.



MAY

Used to express what is possible, factual, or could be factual.
E.g. You **may** go home now, John.

MIGHT

Used to express what is counterfactual, hypothetical, or remotely possible.
E.g. **I might** be a few minutes late.
