The doctor in the photo *administered* a vaccine to his patient. A vaccine is a kind of medicine that cures or prevents diseases. Has your doctor ever administered a vaccine to you?

Hundreds of years ago, Chinese doctors *searched* for the cure for a disease called smallpox. Smallpox *caused* the death of many people. The doctors *tried* everything to find a cure. To their surprise, Chinese doctors *realized* that when they *vaccinated* healthy patients with tiny amounts of smallpox, the patients *developed* an immunity to the virus. The doctors *discovered* a way to help their patients!

Many years later, European doctors still *struggled* to stop smallpox. They *tried* the cure invented by Chinese doctors, which *helped*, but too many patients *continued* suffering. A young doctor *heard* stories that cow farmers in England were immune to smallpox. He *discovered* that these cow farmers were infected with cowpox. Cowpox is like smallpox, but not as dangerous. When the doctor *injected* people with a cowpox vaccine, it *protected* them against smallpox! This new cowpox vaccine was soon *used* all over Europe.

Doctors and scientists *learned* that when people are vaccinated with a weak virus, they become immune to stronger viruses. Because of vaccines, many diseases that once *caused* millions of people to suffer are now history.

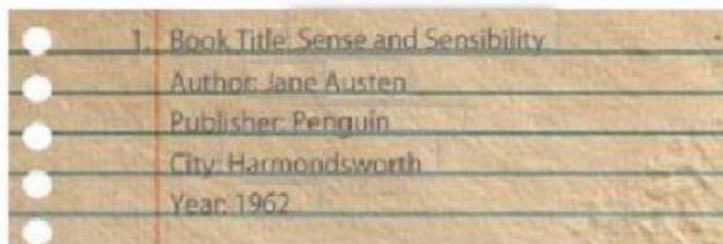
