COUNTABLE AND UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS



COUNTABLE NOUNS

Have a singular and plural form

→ a tree two trees

Can use a *singular* verb or
a *plural* verb

→ The **book** *is* old.

→ The **books** *are* old.

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Have only one form (no plural)

→ butter butters

Always use a singular verb

→ **Sugar** *is* sweet.

Cannot use *a, an* or *a number*
before them

→ **a** rice **two** rice
→ **a** bread **two** bread

UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS ARE OFTEN...

ABSTRACT IDEAS (cannot touch)

love, freedom, education, luck,
help, beauty, music, thunder

LIQUIDS & GASES

water, milk, wine, oil, coffee, rain,
soup, air, smoke, blood, juice, fog

MADE OF SMALLER PARTS

sugar, rice, salt, sand, flour, dirt,
dust, traffic, grass, spaghetti

MATERIALS

wood, glass, paper, gold, silver,
ice, iron, cotton, wool, steel

SOME FOOD (cut into small parts)

bread, fish, cheese, chocolate,
meat, bacon, food, ham


