

Florence Nightingale

Florence Nightingale was one of the first women to organize a women's medical service at the front.

Florence was well educated in music, art and literature. From her childhood, she had nursed poor people and sick dogs, cats and horses. She wanted to become a nurse. She visited hospitals and read books on nursing.

At that time, Britain was in war. The hospitals were dirty. The patients were dying in thousands. Florence wrote a letter to the Minister of War, offered her service, and soon went to the front.

When Florence Nightingale came to the front, she found that everything was lacking: beds, clothes, soap, plates. She bought everything with her own money.

Every night with a little lamp to light her way she walked by the beds.

The soldiers called her "Lady with the lamp" and they all loved her. In 1855

Florence Nightingale was made Inspector of all hospitals at the front. She fell ill but continued her work. When Florence came back to England, she was an invalid for life. Florence could not leave her house and often even her bed but she worked hard.

She changed the whole system of hospital organization of the army.

She wrote books on nursing. In 1906, she organized a school for nurses. She changed hospital planning in England. In 1907 Florence Nightingale became the first woman awarded with the highest British civil order. Three years later, a very tired old woman of ninety, she died in her sleep.

Now in London not far from the Westminster Bridge there is a Museum of Florence Nightingale. In 1912, the International Red Cross League established the Florence Nightingale medal as the highest international award to nurses.
