Sweden	Swed <b>ish</b>	Wales	<b>Welsh</b>

# Be: positive forms

Look carefully at the long and contracted forms. Take time to learn these. We use the contracted forms in spoken English.

Positive (+)	
Full form	Contraction
I <b>am</b> an employee.	I' <b>m</b> an employee.
You <b>are</b> a good singer.	You' <b>re</b> a good singer.
He <b>is</b> my brother.	He' <b>s</b> my brother.
She <b>is</b> Chinese.	She' <b>s</b> Chinese.
It <b>is</b> rainy.	It' <b>s</b> rainy.
We <b>are</b> sisters.	We ' <b>re</b> sisters
They <b>are</b> from Scotland.	They ' <b>re</b> from Scotland.

# Be: negative forms

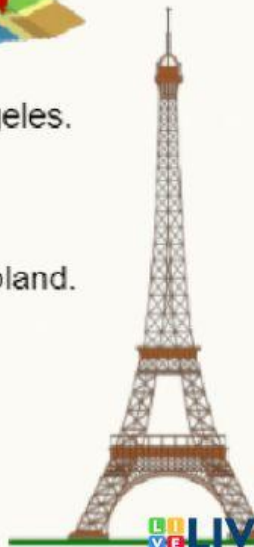
We add *not* to make negative sentences with *be*.

Negative (-)	
Full form	Contraction
I <b>am not</b> an employee.	I'm <b>not</b> an employee.
You <b>are not</b> a good singer.	You're <b>not</b> a good singer.
He <b>is not</b> my brother.	He's <b>not</b> my brother.
She <b>is not</b> Chinese.	She's <b>not</b> Chinese.
It <b>is not</b> rainy.	It's <b>not</b> rainy.
We <b>are not</b> sisters.	We <b>aren't</b> sisters
They <b>are not</b> from Scotland.	They <b>aren't</b> from Scotland.
